## Clean up your act

**Nuclear power isn't the answer, says Robin Oakley. Here's Greenpeace's suggestion for a clean, efficient energy system**

● We need to focus on providing the services people need – warm homes, light, appliances for work and leisure – in the cleanest, most efficient way possible, rather than chasing new supplies of energy to meet an ever-growing demand.

A huge majority of the gas burned in Britain is used in central heating boilers to warm people's houses and hot water. Using less energy by insulating buildings is just common sense, but there are already nine million homes that have been built in the UK with no cavity-wall insulation. We must make sure we only build new homes that are ultra energy efficient.

We can reduce our use of electricity quite simply, too. If every bulb in the country were changed for an energy-efficient one, we'd save more than five million tonnes of CO<sub>2</sub> per year and enough electricity to match the output of the biggest nuclear power station in the country. The government's own research suggests we can massively cut the amount of energy we use – electricity, heat, transport – through measures like these, saving consumers £12bn to boot, all without creating a single gram of dangerous nuclear waste.

The UK's centralised energy system – coal, gas, nuclear power stations – generates electricity that's transmitted on a grid to where it's needed. In this system, two-thirds of the energy generated is wasted as heat, which accounts for 20% of all the UK's CO<sub>2</sub> emissions and is enough to provide all the heating and hot water needs of the entire country. In a decentralised energy system, electricity is generated close to where it's needed. Less fuel is used and emissions are slashed. These local energy generators are called Combined Heat and Power (CHP) stations, and can be up to 95% efficient – more than double the efficiency of centralised power stations. Electricity is generated and the waste heat from this process is used in surrounding homes, offices and factories. Other European countries already use CHP on a massive scale, but Britain has lagged behind.

Finally, we have the best renewable resources in Europe but are second from the bottom in the EU renewables league table. Wind power, and especially wave and tidal power, could mean big business for the UK, but only if government gives them proper support. Simple, clean and efficient power generation is ready to go, but the government's obsession with nuclear power is blocking the way.
